

ABOUT CARLOS CRUZ-DIEZ

The French-Venezuelan artist Carlos Cruz-Diez (Caracas, 1923 – Paris, 2019), the inspiration behind our Learning Lab, is one of the main protagonists of contemporary art, and his research and his writings make him the last great thinker of the 20th century in the realm of color.

An innovator and an inventor, Cruz-Diez tirelessly worked in search of new and better solutions to represent his research on color and its perception as an autonomous reality evolving in space and time, unaided by form or support, in a perpetual present. His works are part of the main worldwide public collections: Museum of Modern Art (MoMA), New York; Tate Modern, London; Musée d'Art Moderne de la Ville de Paris; Centre Pompidou, Paris; Museum of Fine Arts, Houston; Wallraf-Richartz Museum, Cologne.

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
