





In the summer of 2023, CAYÓN Menorca exhibited Joan Miró (Barcelona, 1893-Palma de Mallorca, 1983). The show, the fifth in our Menorcan space since 2018, has the fundamental support of Successió Miró. Presenting some forty works, this is the most ambitious project dedicated to the artist in a commercial gallery in recent years.




